Currently, I am framing my research questions, finalizing my methodological approach, and planning the procedures for generating relevant data. My RAP aligns with my dissertation research. The rubric will be revised based on qualitative data and then delivered to a pilot survey and later a larger sample for further examination of its reliability, factorial structure, and divergent validity.
